Wiaraton District High School 1892 - 2005

Wiaraton was established as a High School District by by-law passed on June 6, 1891, and early in 1892, the school opened its doors for the eager students of the area. The oldest section of the present school building, the office area and the room above it, erected in 1878 as a public school, provided accommodation for the Wiaraton High School in its earliest days. Early in the present century, the main entrance, with its attractive arch, a centre hall, and three classrooms were added to the original building. The old stone facade and the centre arch still remain to greet one approaching the school on William Street.

Two classes were added, along with washrooms and basement space around 1930. After World War II, the school expanded rapidly, and Wiaraton High School became Wiaraton District High School, with the formation of the District Board in 1954. The new District High School Board found it necessary to add three additions to the school, using local limestone to complement the exterior architecture of the new additions to the old stone building. Inside, a Library, Science facilities, Home Economics and Industrial Arts rooms, a Cafeteria, Gymnasium/Auditorium, and classrooms were provided by the first two of these additions, while the third, in 1967, equipped the school with a modern commercial wing. Instrumental music was later introduced. In 1985-1986 the last major addition was added. This created a modern shop facility, which includes a wood and a metal shop along with a modern computer lab for designing projects. The final addition was added in 2000, and expands the RDL facilities in the school.
